Due Date: Real Estate first installments should be paid to the **Town of Kildare Treasurer** by January 31, 2026. **After** January 31, mail all payments to the Juneau County Treasurer in Mauston. Penalties will be added to late payments.

Pay By Mail: The tax bill stub and check or money order, payable to Town of Kildare, should be mailed to **Kildare Treasurer, N2865 County Rd HH, Lyndon Station, WI 53944.**

If you would like a receipt, please enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your payment. Be sure to include your tax bill stub for proper credit.

There is a service fee.

Pay in Person: Check/Money Order/ Credit Card payments in-person will **ONLY** be accepted on **Saturday, January 24, 2026**, from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at the Kildare Town Hall, N2592 26th Ave, Lyndon Station, WI 53944. **NO CASH PAYMENTS.**

No tax payments will be accepted in person at the Treasurer's Residence.

Dog Licensing: Juneau County uses an online system for dog licensing. Visit <https://www.doglicenses.us/WI/Juneau/> to pay for your dog license.

All questions should be directed to the Juneau County Clerk.

Special Charges: Resolution 03-2025 was passed on April 16, 2025, allowing special charges to be placed on all Town of Kildare properties with assessed improvements or camper permits to cover the cost of garbage and recycling services paid by the town in 2024. Property owners will see this charge on their tax bill if it was not paid by October 1, 2025. More information on this resolution can be found at www.kildaretownship.com.

This Special Charge is for all properties with assessed improvement, the only way to have the charge removed is by having the assessed improvement removed and documented with the assessor. (exp. If the property only has a vacant home, shed or other structures that are not safe to be used or just not needed can be removed to become a vacant property with no improvements.)

In Wisconsin, an "assessed improvement" refers to any permanent addition or significant upgrade to land (like a house, garage, decks, shed, barn, etc...) that increases its market value, which assessors then add to the property's total assessed value for property tax purposes, with the assessment determined as of January 1st each year.

Side notes from Republic Services:

If your garbage/recycling is not picked up on Monday, leave your carts out and contact them at 608-548-9066, they will make sure to get them picked up. They are short drivers so the route may take two days to complete when they only have one driver on the route. Thanks for your patience with the new drivers learning new routes.
